



Education for All Handicapped Children Act (Public Law 94-142, Part B) • Known as the Mainstreaming Law • Requires states to provide a free & appropriate public education for children with disabilities (ages 5-18) • Requires individualized education programs (IEP)	<ul> <li>Education of the Handicapped Act (Public Law 99-457)</li> <li>Requires states to extend free &amp; appropriate education to children with disabilities (ages 3-5)</li> <li>Establishes early intervention programs for infants and toddlers with disabilities (age birth-2)</li> </ul>	Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) (Public Law 101-476) • Established "people first" language • Extends special education services to include social work, assistive technology, & rehabilitation services • Requires states to provide bilingual education programs for students with disabilities	Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) (Public Law 108-446) • Allows districts to use a response to intervention(RTI) model for determining whether a child has a specific learning disability & no longer requires that a child have a severe discrepancy between achievement & intellectual ability to qualify.


### Advocates for Person-First Language

#### What is Person-First Language

"At its core, person-first language seeks to acknowledge the inherent and equal value of every individual, before attaching any other descriptors or identities the person may view as secondary or not intrinsic. Communicating using person-first language begins with empathy."

### What is Person-First Language

- Emphasizes the person first, not the disability
- Describes what a person has, not what a person is
- Used to speak respectfully about an individual with a disability
- Handicapped, Special Needs, Wheelchair bound



#### What is Person-First Language

Acknowledges that students with disabilities are students first, not their disability. Student First Language recognizes that ALL people have many different characteristics, skills, strengths, challenges and interests, having a disability should not define who you are or the way you are viewed by others.
